## FACT SHEET JANÉE ANGEL AND HARY KHANO

- Janée Angel moved to Belgium in 2004 to work with Arabic speakers in an Arabic/French church in Brussels. Hary came to Belgium as a refugee in 2000.
- In 2011, Janée and Hary moved to Antwerp to plant the first Evangelical Arabic church outside of the Brussels area in Belgium.
- Antwerp is the second largest city in Belgium. It is also the diamond cutting capital of the world.
- Janée and Hary live in a Moroccan neighborhood in Antwerp.
- They work with refugees and immigrants who are Arabic-speaking.
- Their ministry is one of welcome and hospitality. They help refugees migrate from dangerous areas (like Syria) to safety.
- Once refugees arrive in Belgium, Janée and Hary help them find a place to belong.
- Their church plant holds weekly worship services and Bible studies, has a music ministry and a children's program; Janée hosts women's events and a prayer group.
- Hary dreamed of opening a Ministry House to welcome Arab refugees. In 2019, that dream became a reality.
- Thanks to generous donations from CBF churches, the Offering for Global Missions, the church plant in Antwerp, and money from Janée and Hary's own savings, the Ministry House is now open.
- Between the church and the Ministry House, ministry happens every single day in Antwerp. There are worship services on Sundays, weekly Bible studies, Dutch lessons, and prayer meetings. The Ministry House is open all week for people to gather for meals, conversation and to play ping pong.
- Janée and Hary dream of planting an Evangelical Arabic church in every city in Belgium. They want refugees and immigrants to know they have a place to belong.
